<p>φ <b>Danger Ahead: Early Warning Signs of Teen Dating Violence</b> 4 pages, helps teens recognize the early signs of an abusive relationship, addresses many myths young people have about violence and control in their relationships.</p>		
<p>φ <b>Facts about children and domestic violence</b> 2-sided, provides statistics about children and domestic violence and information about the effects of domestic violence on children, including behavioral change and increased risk for other social and health issues (with citations)</p>		
<p>φ <b>Warning signs in children</b> One page, lists feelings and behaviors common in infants and preschoolers, school age children, and adolescents.</p>		
<p>φ <b>Restraining Order Information Sheet</b> Two-sided handout, details ways to avoid violating a 209A order if one has been issued against you, and what will happen if you violate the order.</p>

While any batterer has the potential to kill, the likelihood of homicide is greater when these factors are present. Includes guidelines for safely interviewing victims.

INFORMATION FOR PROVIDERS		
φ <b>Spectrum of Prevention</b> Based on the work of Dr. Marshall Swift and Larry Cohen, this handout lists the 6 levels in the spectrum of prevention and provides local examples pertinent to the prevention of violence.		
φ <b>The Health Effects of Intimate Partner and Sexual Violence</b> One page, depicts the fatal and non-fatal effects that intimate partner/sexual violence can have on an individual's health.		
φ <b>Women Affected by Trauma, Addiction, and Mental Illness</b> 2-sided, developed by the Boston Consortium of Services for Families in Recovery, describes the high co-occurrence of these three issues, and how providers can make a difference in the complex lives of their clients.		
φ <b>Examples of Abusive Behavior</b> A 3 page handout with examples of physical, sexual, and emotional abuse; abuse of refugee or immigrant women; and abuse of gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender people.		
φ <b>Indicators of Abuse</b> Designed for providers, this one page handout gives examples of clinical and behavioral indicators of abuse.		
φ <b>Common diagnostic indicators of abuse in the dental setting</b> A one page handout that gives examples of orofacial/dental trauma, chronic pain syndromes due to cumulative trauma, and tissue lesions due to abuse that are commonly seen in dental settings.		
φ <b>Screening for Domestic Violence</b> This one page handout includes general guidelines for screening and a few sample questions.		
φ <b>Domestic Violence and the Role of the Dentist</b> Developed for public health dentists, this collection of resources contains screening strategies and guidelines, screening protocols, a guide to domestic violence resources, and a selected bibliography and key articles.

<p>φ <b>Personalized Safety Plan</b> This 3 page plan helps clients develop specific steps for safety during an explosive incident, when preparing to leave, in the home, with a protective order, on the job and in public, safety and emotional health, and a brief list of important items to take when leaving.</p>		
<p>φ <b>Applicable laws and reporting requirements for Massachusetts</b> This 2-page sheet briefly describes the laws relevant to domestic violence and the legal requirements for reporting injuries and various types of abuse in Massachusetts.</p>		

<p>φ <b>Safety and confidentiality in home visiting</b> Designed for the home visiting nurse or health advocate, this one page handout provides suggestions for maintaining the safety and confidentiality of both the provider and the client.</p>		
<p>φ <b>Self care for providers working with domestic violence</b> A one-page handout with information on how doing domestic violence work can affect the provider and a few suggestions on how to address these effects.</p>

<p>φ <b>Choose Not to Abuse</b> Developed by teens for young men, this 4 poster series shows a half face shot of a youth (either African American, Caucasian or Latino) and a series of phrases that may be commonly used by perpetrators in violent teen dating relationships. The tag line contains the message “Whether it’s Physical, Verbal or Emotional, It’s all Abuse. Stop. Choose Not to Abuse.” Each pack contains one each of the 4 designs listed below.</p>
